Giving the Homeless a Sense of Dignity

ocks. Such a simple wardrobe staple. But for Boston's homeless population, a fresh pair represents "respect and dignity," says Catherine Minahan of Boston Health Care for the Homeless Program (BHCHP).

Socks drive every year during the baseball season, providing new socks to the program's homeless clients, helping to ward off infection.

"Our patients are on their feet all day, every day," says Minahan.

The 32-year-old program serves Greater Boston's homeless population in a variety of ways, notably at the Barbara McInnis House, a 104-bed facility in the South End that offers short-term medical and recuperative services for homeless patients too sick to live in shelters or on the streets but not sick enough for a hospital bed. Referrals come from throughout the city — sometimes from hospitals and other times from BHCHP's team of doctors, psychiatrists, nurses, and case managers who make rounds throughout the city streets, in alleys and under bridges, to check on the most vulnerable.

Some patients are recovering from chemotherapy; others suffer from pneumonia, HIV, cirrhosis, or diabetes. BHCHP serves roughly 12,000 patients each year.

ranging from toiletries to puzzle books
to Dunkin' Donuts gift cards — to make
life a little easier.

"Their days can be monotonous, and this makes life a little brighter," Minahan says.


Halloween Parade
