Clay Soper Memorial Fund presents "If They Had Known" at Woburn Memorial High School

Woburn, MA – As part of an ongoing effort to share Clay Soper's story with as many as possible, the Clay Soper Memorial Fund held a showing of the documentary "If They Had Known" to students at Woburn Memorial High School (WMHS) on February 13. All freshmen and sophomores viewed the film, which was also shown earlier in the month to students in various Wellness and Business classes and to the Students Against Destructive Decisions (SADD) Club.

"If They Had Known" tells the true story of Clay Soper's accidental death in 2015. The film and documentary program educate students about the risks of mixing prescription drugs with alcohol. For this recent showing, Clay's mother, Genny Soper, introduced the film and took questions afterwards. "I was truly touched by the number of students who spoke to me after the film, expressing sympathy for my family and appreciation for our efforts to get this message to as many students as we can," said Soper.
